HOMOPHOBIC BULLYING IN SCHOOLS

One of the issues being examined by the East Midlands LGBT Forum is that of how schools are tackling homophobic bullying. A survey of local schools has just started. It looks at schools' websites, searching for antibullying policies and where none is shown on the website an e-mail is sent enquiring about their policy. So far, some schools exhibit fairly good policies on their websites, some produce policies on request, some don't reply to requests and, amazingly, some don't have websites. We hope to have fuller details later this year.

DERBYSHIRE FRIEND IS 30

Derbyshire Friend, the gay charity located on Friary Street, has been improving the lives of Lesbians, Gay men, Bisexuals and Transgender people for the last three decades.

However, I go back further. As an isolated teenager of the homophobic 1960s, unlike heterosexual boys who met girls in dance halls and public houses, I had to meet my friends in public toilets and the Turkish Baths on Reginald Street. We were barely tolerated in the passageway of the Corporation Hotel in the old Cattle Market. I can remember being frozen out by my own kind. These were the superior, secretive, sneering, professional men who, in a climate of fear, rehearsed their artificial vowels in the Friary Hotel in an effort to demean the 'lower orders'.

In 1983, Derbyshire Friend began the long and difficult process of rescuing me and many thousands from all that. I'm so grateful.

EQUAL MARRIAGE! WHAT FOR?

"Why are you banging on about Gay Marriage, when you've got Civil Partnerships - they give you all the equality you need" say some politicians, some clerics and "newspapers" like the Mail.

Let's put aside the religious bit and consider the following scenario.

You and your civil partner go on holiday with two Canadian friends who are also legal partners. While abroad, there is a dreadful accident. Your partner is killed and so is one of the Canadians. The foreign authorities treat the Canadian friend with great sympathy and support. To you they say "who is the next of kin?" You say "I am". They say "No, you're not, who is the real next of kin? We need the contact details of relations in the UK."

Why the difference? The difference is the word "marriage"; in Canada you can have same sex marriage. There are several countries which recognise the legality of same-sex partnerships which include the word "marriage", but do not recognise civil partnerships.

UNTOLD STORIES

"Untold Stories" is a Heritage Lottery sponsored LGBT history project organised by Leicester LGBT Centre. The project has received praise from Leicester's Mayor Sir Peter Soulsby.

Untold Stories was set up to capture the memories, lives and personal histories of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans community in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland and their experiences from pre-1967, 1970's, 1980's, 1990's and more recently.

The first stage largely involved younger LGBT people hearing and recording the reminiscences of older LGBT people. It is hoped that these recordings will soon be made available for all to hear on a new website.






The project's research has also produced a timeline display acknowledging significant national and Leicestershire-based events. The display is at present in the LGBT Centre but has also been seen in Leicester's Central library see left.

It is hoped to have a base for the project's materials and use them to form the nucleus of a permanent museum.

Some of the people who have been interviewed form a suspended display with a picture of the interviewee on one side and a potted biography on the other. The project has also started a collection of memorabilia and ephemera. Thinking big, there is talk of going beyond a local museum and attempting to house a national LGBT museum

QB'S BITS


- Lirain (Lesbians into Real Ale in Nottingham) seems to have disappeared - if we're wrong, let us know.
